Starting with the comfy journey from KU to Lodwar and then to Lobur, (which was abit rough), the warm welcome at the mission, the interactions with the community and exploring the other missions which are Kokuslei, Todonyang and Nariokotome (Small Spain). The daily routine comprised of attending masses at the various out stations, facilitating learning process in nearby Primary schools and engaging in the community events/ activities such as burial ceremonies. We learnt a number of things about

the Turkana culture, including some words of the language. We made friends and networked with the people we interacted with. We got inspired by the project namely ' Furrows in the dessert ', which has enabled agricultural production in the area. Also the missionaries, donors and sponsors of the mission who are giving back to the community in great ways, considering the government has neglected most social amenities in the area.
